Kenosha Achievement Center tailors the program to offer high-quality home visiting services to meet the direct needs of local children and families. EHS serves roughly 140 families annually who reside within the Kenosha Unified School District boundaries. On top of home visiting services, in order to address and prevent additional risks, KAC's Early Head Start program provides a full range of services to enrolled children and families, including health and mental health, nutrition, and family support services.
